

TTT Program Evaluation Update

In 2007, the International Leadership Training Committee (ILTC) proposed a Train the Trainer process as a response to strategic plan indicators #1 Leadership is the key to success and #4 Strengthening existing chapters. ILTC launched a search for an international pool of trainers who would be ultimately responsible for facilitating these TTT workshops. As a result, six candidates were successfully chosen. A writeshop session was held in November 2007 to develop a new design of the TTT program. The writeshop identified four guiding principles that would be at the core of each TTT:

1. Enhance training competencies of participants
2. Strengthen the ability of participants to design and deliver effective training programmes
3. Empower participants to develop a training strategy
4. Encourage participants to promote the educational principles of CISV through their training programmes

To date, thirteen TTT workshops have been held with a total of 250 participants.

As part of the TTT plan, a call for IPT applicants occurred both in 2009 and 2010. In 2009, one of the original members of the IPT stepped down. Two of the applicants were added to the list of IPT. In 2010, one of the members of IPT stepped down and three new members have been added to IPT and the process is still active for this application session.

During the 2009 AIM, the board of trustees requested a program evaluation of the TTT. During this time, I had been in discussion with CISV and Miami University about focusing the structure of my doctoral dissertation research with the framework of CISV. It was agreed that this program evaluation of the TTT function as my doctoral research project. The following is a summary of proceedings to date.

December 2009:	Dissertation proposal accepted by the Department of Educational Leadership (EDL) at Miami University and the Institutional Review Board (IRB).
January 2010:	CISV organized Writeshop 2010 to discuss common strategies across the programmes of CISV. Since the program committee chairs and other international representatives would be present, this was an opportunity to collect preliminary data. Interviews were held with international program chairs, staff of the international office and members of the international pool of trainers. In addition, data was gathered from the archives held within the international office.
Spring 2010	In cooperation with the International office and members of the dissertation committee, one survey questionnaire was developed for the trainees of the TTT and a second questionnaire for trustees of each National Association (NA).
June 2010	Surveys were distributed online.
July 2010	Beginnings of data review and analysis. (see attached chart)
August 2010	Preliminary data presented at AIM
